Dear Parents and Whānau,

This year we are having a Leadership Camp at Kokako Lodge for all Year 6, 7 and 8 students. The camp outline of activities has been included in this initial camp information pack.

Today we had our first meeting with Year 6, 7 and 8 students to give details about the camp and the purpose.

### Details of our Leadership Camp:

- Dates: Term 4, Week 6: Tuesday 21st November ~ Friday 24th November
- Activities for four days. Sleeping at camp three nights total.
- Location: Kokako Lodge, 235 Falls Road, Hunua
- Cost: total cost per student is \$240.00
- Students: all year 6, 7 and 8 students
- Purpose: to build the leadership of our senior students and ensure a successful and confident transition for:
  - ❑ Year 6's into Year 7 for 2018
  - ❑ Year 7's into Year 8's for 2018.
  - ❑ A celebration of senior student leadership for our Year 8's before transitioning to secondary school.
  - ❑ Adults attending: five adults including Hunua School staff.

### Camp Fees and Fundraising:

We understand the stress that can be attributed to organising and affording camp fees, particularly within the next twelve weeks. We are supportive of students fundraising independently to contribute to their camp fees. The school will not be actively fundraising for the leadership camp but will co-construct with students ways that they are able to independently raise money. We are wanting EVERY student to attend as we would not want any child to miss out on the opportunity to participate and gain unique experiences at our leadership camp. *Raft Building	The Great Pancake Race		OWN
Groups are taught some knot tying and lashing techniques. Groups use bamboo, inflatable tyres and rope to build a raft. Then they get to test on the water.	A great activity for the end of camp. Groups compete to gain points by making the best pancake that tells a story (of their time at camp, for example). There is also a charade competition at the beginning from which they collect all the equipment to cook the pancakes. They are scored on creativity, teamwork and taste. Clean-up is also included.
