Areas you can approach to volunteer in:

- Rest home drop offs - gift basket or drawings or stories etc? "Make a friend" and learn and report about their life?
- Botanical Gardens volunteering
- Kauri Dieback work/Hunua Ranges volunteering
- Kokako Lodge/Camp Adair clean ups/work experience
- School working bees/planting/carpark work
- Local churches
- Reaching out to local elderly
- Working on a farm
- Helping at the General Store/Hunua Hall/Tennis Club/Fire Station
- Pest Detective

You will need to complete a minimum of eight hours volunteer work at one or more of these.

Your report needs to include the following:

- Factual language
- Pictures/photos/diagrams
- How you felt during the activity/activities
- What you did
- Where you did it
- How did you get involved in this
- Who you did it for
- How did you feel at the end of the activity/activities
- Written in your own words.
- Complete and attach time sheet card

NB: Any photos taken of other people in the community must have their permission to be used in your report
